WILLET LIBRARY

Willet Library is open 8:30 am - 8:00 pm during fall and spring semesters and 8:30 am - 5:00 pm during holidays. WALL members are allowed to use the library during operating hours. Members can check out up to 3 books at a time with a standard check out period of 21 days. Spaces in the library include several reservable study rooms, 2 classrooms (including a 36 seat computer lab), our Archives, and various open seating areas. Printing is available for \$.10 per page for b/w and \$.25 per page for color.

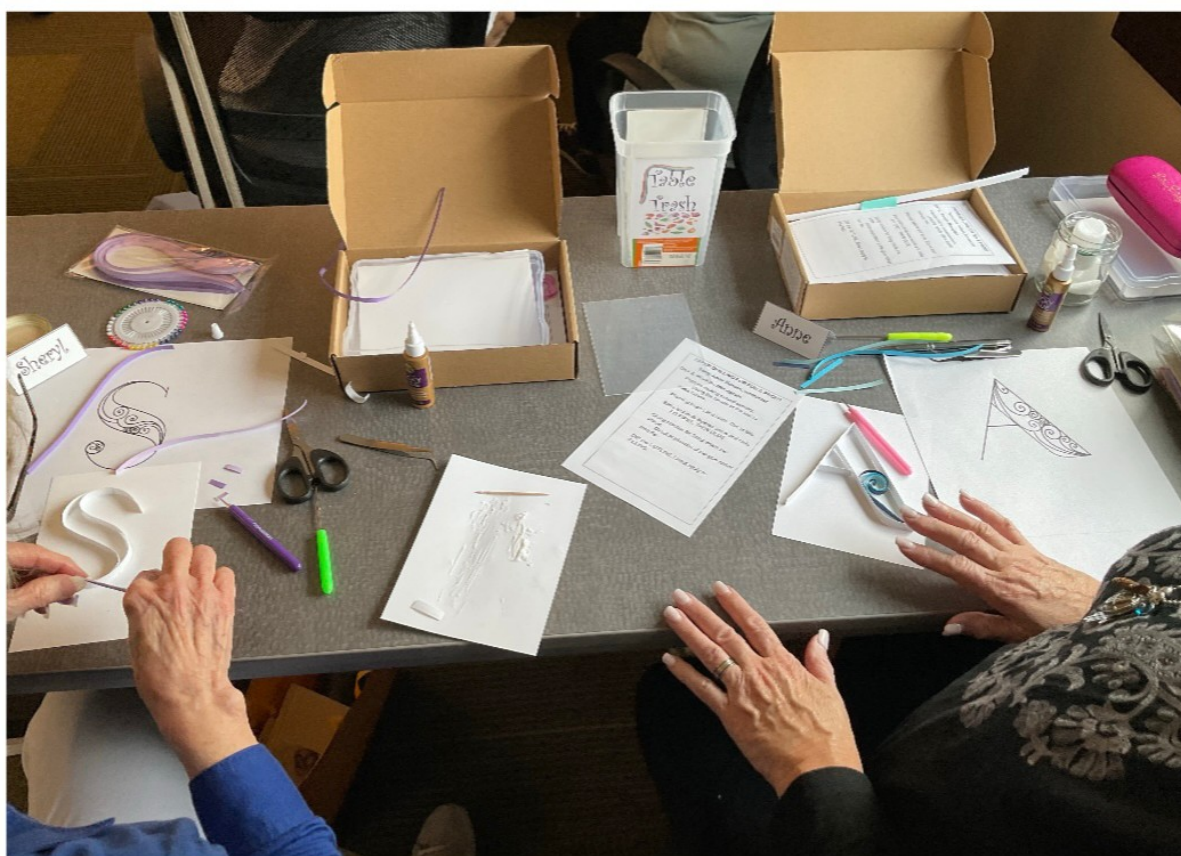

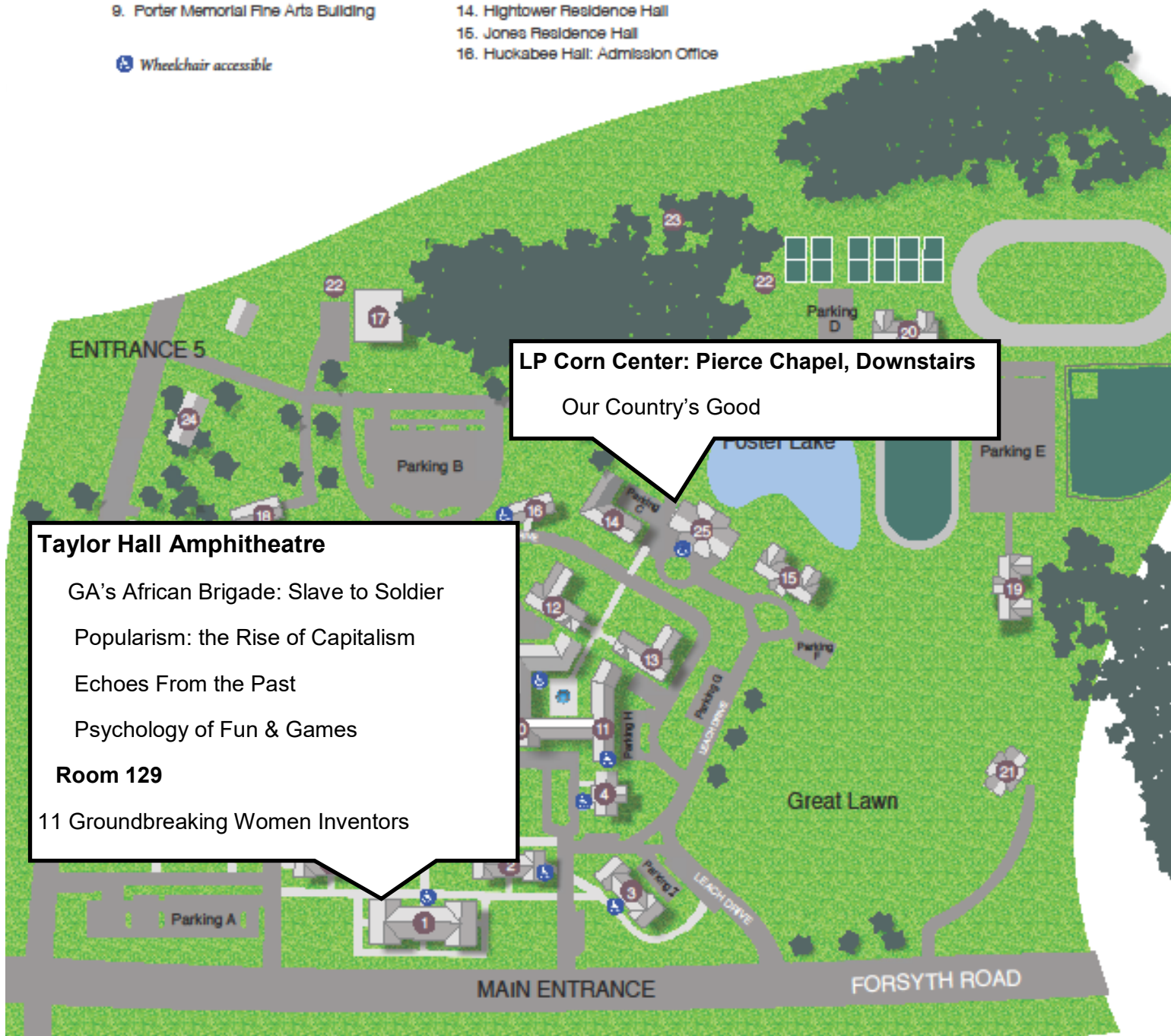
