ZOOM - the 21st Century Chalkboard

The COVID pandemic dictates that we cannot meet in person for the time being. The board, in consultation with educator friends, is constantly searching for ways to present the content and allow dialogue even when we cannot safely meet together in person. Our best bet going into the fall semester is the online learning platform ZOOM. It has the advantages of: (a) it is the method already used by Wesleyan professors (b) it does not require special equipment beyond a personal webenabled device (computer, tablet, IPad) for presenters and students and (c) it can "broadcast" to up to 75 students. There are many other advantages that are available to the presenter, which will be apparent in the presentations. We do plan to return to in-person learning when it is safe.

To connect to ZOOM

- 1) Enter **ZOOM.us** in the URL bar at the top of the page
- 2) Choose "Free Sign-Up"
- 3) Enter birthdate information, click continue
- 4) Enter & confirm your email address when prompted (the prompt will be midway in the right column)
- 5) You will need to assign a password, so have one ready
- 6) ZOOM will talk you through a sample meeting
- 7) When it is time to join a WALL meeting go to
- ZOOM.us and click on "Join a meeting."
- 8) Enter the code which will be provided by WALL prior to the meeting.

When possible the URL for class will be sent in your email reminder and you can cut and paste to connect.

Course Descriptions for September ZOOM Classes

Wesleyan College History - Taught by Dr. Vivia Fowler. Wesleyan President Fowler will begin WALL's 10th Anniversary year with a history of Wesleyan College including academics, traditions and, of course, a glimpse into the future.

Fascinating Relationship of Humans and Bacteria - Taught by Dr. Henna Iqbal. Humans and bacteria live together in a complex relationship. What happens if one of the two is not cooperating?

History of Christianity Part 1 - Taught by Dr. Richard Davies. Part 1 will discuss the first 1,100 years of Christianity and "How the Bible Came to Be."

Sin on Celluloid: American Film 1930 - 1934 - Taught by Robert Fieldsteel. This course will review the five glorious years when Hollywood films enjoyed a freedom of expression that ended with the strict enforcement of the censorship code in mid-1934. It will examine four of these films, featuring such stars as Barbara Stanwyck, Mae West, Clark Gable, Cary Grant, Joan Blondell, Leslie Howard, Norma Shearer and Lionel Barrymore.
